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

TWENTY-SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Genesis 2:18-24

God created many different animals in an attempt to make a suitable partner for the first man. Then he took a rib from the man as he slept and built it up into a woman. At last God had created someone who equaled the man, as she was "bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh" and they proved to be suitable partners for each other.

Second Reading: Hebrews 2:9-11

This passage describes how Jesus will become perfect through his suffering. It also reminds us that Jesus' Father is our Father as well, making him unashamed to call us his brothers and sisters.

Gospel: Mark 10:2-16

The people began to ask Jesus if it was acceptable for a man to divorce his wife. Jesus tells them that two people who have been joined together by God should not be separated. People began bringing their children to Jesus, but the disciples tried to send them away. Jesus grew angry and told his disciples to allow the children to come to him

The Saint of the Week St. John XXIII (October 11)

The firstborn son of a farming family in Sotto il Monte, near Bergamo in northern Italy, Angelo Giuseppe Roncalli was always proud of his down-to-earth roots.

After his ordination in 1904, Fr. Roncalli returned to Rome for canon law studies. He soon worked as his bishop's secretary, Church history teacher in the seminary, and as publisher of the diocesan paper.

His service as a stretcher-bearer for the Italian army during World War I gave him a firsthand knowledge of war. In 1921, Fr. Roncalli was made national director in Italy of the Society for the Propagation of the Faith. He also found time to teach patristics at a seminary in the Eternal City. In 1925, he became a papal diplomat, serving first in Bulgaria, then in Turkey, and finally in France. During World War II, he became well acquainted with Orthodox Church leaders. With the help of Germany's ambassador to Turkey, Archbishop Roncalli helped save an estimated 24,000 Jewish people.

Named a cardinal and appointed patriarch of Venice in 1953, he was finally a residential bishop. A month short of entering his 78th year, Cardinal Roncalli was elected pope, taking the name John. Pope John took his work very seriously.

His most famous encyclicals were Mother and Teacher (1961) and Peace on Earth (1963). Pope John XXIII enlarged the membership in the College of Cardinals and made it more international. At his address at the opening of the Second Vatican Council, he criticized the "prophets of doom" who "in these modern times see nothing but prevarication and ruin." Pope John XXIII set a tone for the Council when he said, "The Church has always opposed... errors. Nowadays, however, the Spouse of Christ prefers to make use of the medicine of mercy rather than that of severity."

On his deathbed, Pope John said: "It is not that the gospel has changed; it is that we have begun to understand it better. Those who have lived as long as I have...were enabled to compare different cultures and traditions, and know that the moment has come to discern the signs of the times, to seize the opportunity and to look far ahead." He died on June 3, 1963.

Polskie Duszpasterstwo w Parafii św. Bernarda i św. Stanisława Kostki



27 NIEDZIELA ZWYKLA B

Z Reguły pasterskiej św. Grzegorza Wielkiego, papieża

Pasterz niech bedzie roztropny w milczeniu, a pożyteczny w mówieniu; nie powinien rozgłaszać tego, o czym należałoby milczeć, ani zamilczać tego, co się powinno powiedzieć. Albowiem podobnie jak nierozważne słowo wprowadza w bład, tak nieroztropne milczenie pozostawia w błędzie tych, którzy mogliby poznać prawdę. A tymczasem nierozważni pasterze w obawie przed utratą ludzkich względów często powstrzymuja sie od otwartego głoszenia tego, co słuszne. Nie strzegą owczarni - powiada Prawda - z gorliwością dobrych pasterzy, ale postępują jak najemnicy, uciekając w obliczu nadchodzącego wilka i zasłaniając się milczeniem.

Dlatego Pan karci ich przez proroka, mówiąc: "To nieme psy, niezdolne, by zaszczekać". Dlatego też uskarża się dalej w słowach: "Nie stanęliście naprzeciw ani nie budowaliście murów wokół domu Izraela, by się ostać w walce w dniu Pana". Stanąć naprzeciw oznacza odważnym słowem stanąć w obronie owczarni przeciw władcom tego świata. Ostać się w walce w dzień Pana oznacza stawić czoła wojującym bezbożnym ze względu na umiłowanie sprawiedliwości.

Czymże jest dla pasterza lęk przed mówieniem prawdy, jeśli nie ucieczką w milczenie? Kto zaś staje w obronie owczarni, ten wznosi przeciwko nieprzyjaciołom mur wokół domu Izraela. Dlatego powiedziano popadającemu w grzechy ludowi: "Prorocy twoi miewali dla ciebie widzenia próżne i bezsensowne; nie odsłaniali twej nieprawości, by cię nakłonić do nawrócenia". W Piśmie świętym proroków nazywa się niekiedy nauczycielami, którzy przez ujawnienie przemijalności rzeczy obecnych ukazują przyszłe. Słowo Boże wyrzuca im fałszywe widzenia, bo lękając się wystąpić przeciwko złu, tchórzliwie schlebiają grzesznikom, obiecując bezpieczeństwo. Nie odsłaniają nieprawości grzeszników, ponieważ powstrzymują się od karcenia.

Słowa skarcenia są jakby kluczem, który odsłania winę, nierzadko nie znaną nawet temu, kto ją popełnił. Stąd święty Paweł powiada: "Aby mógł przekazywać zdrową naukę i przekonywać opornych". Stąd i Malachiasz mówi: "Wargi kapłana powinny strzec wiedzy, a wtedy pouczenia będą u niego szukali, bo jest on wysłannikiem Pana Zastępów". Stąd także Pan upomina przez Izajasza: "Krzycz na całe gardło, nie przestawaj, podnoś twój głos jak trąba".

Tak więc ktokolwiek staje się kapłanem, podejmuje się zadania herolda. Ma on ogłaszać nadejście straszliwego Sędziego, który się zbliża. Jeśli więc kapłan nie umie sprawować posługi głoszenia, jakże będzie wołał ów niemy herold? Dlatego właśnie Duch Święty spoczął nad pierwszymi pasterzami w postaci języków; tych, których napełnił, uczynił natychmiast zdolnymi do głoszenia o Nim.





From Fr. Marcin's Desk

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Today Christ offers us words on marriage. The passage opens with the provocation of the Pharisees who ask Jesus if it is "lawful for a man to divorce his wife," as the Law of Moses provides. Jesus firstly, with the wisdom and authority that come to Him from the Father, puts the Mosaic prescription into perspective, saying: "For your hardness of heart he" — that is, the ancient legislator — "wrote you this commandment." Thus, it is a concession that is needed to mend the flaws created by our selfishness, but it does not correspond to the Creator's original intention.

And here, Jesus again takes up the Book of Genesis: "from the beginning of creation, 'God made them male and female. For this reason, a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one." And he concludes: "What therefore God has joined together, let not man put asunder". In the Creator's original plan, it is not that a man marries a woman and, if things do not go well, he repudiates her. No. Rather, the man and the woman are called to recognize each other, to complete each other, to help each other in marriage.

This teaching of Jesus is very clear and defends the dignity of marriage as a union of love which implies fidelity. What allows the spouses to remain united in marriage is a love of mutual giving supported by Christ's grace. However, if in the spouses' individual interests, one's own satisfaction prevails, then their union cannot endure.

The Gospel passage itself reminds us, with great realism, that man and woman, called to experience a relationship of love, may regretfully behave in a way that places it in crisis. Jesus does not admit all that can lead to the failure of the relationship. He does so in order to confirm God's plan, in which the power and beauty of the human relationship emerge. The Church, on the one hand, does not tire of confirming the beauty of the family as it was consigned to us by Scripture and by Tradition; at the same time, she strives to make her maternal closeness tangibly felt by those who experience relationships that are broken or that continue in a difficult and trying way.
