

TWENTY-EIGHTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Wisdom 7:7-11

This poem discusses how the spirit of wisdom is far more beautiful than any riches could be. All gold is no more than sand when compared to the importance of wisdom, which often leads people to the other good things in life.

Second Reading: Hebrews 4:12-13

God's perception of people is called "sharper than any two-edged sword." God is able to know the thoughts and feelings of all his people. We can hide nothing from him, and will need to account for all he has seen in us.

Gospel: Mark 10:17-30

A man asks Jesus how he can share in everlasting life. Jesus tells him to sell his possessions and travel with them. The man refuses and Jesus tells his disciples how difficult it is for a rich person to enter heaven if they are too concerned with their possessions. The disciples remind Jesus that they gave up everything for him, but he assures them they will be rewarded with everlasting life.

The Saint of the Week

Margaret Mary Alacoque

(October 16)

Margaret Mary was chosen by Christ to arouse the Church to a realization of the love of God symbolized by the heart of Jesus.

Her early years were marked by sickness and a painful home situation. "The heaviest of my crosses was that I could do nothing to lighten the cross my mother was suffering." After considering marriage for some time, Margaret Mary entered the Order of the Visitation nuns at the age of 24.

A Visitation nun was "not to be extraordinary except by being ordinary," but the young nun was not to enjoy this anonymity. A fellow novice termed Margaret Mary humble, simple, and frank, but above all, kind and patient under sharp criticism and correction. She could not meditate in the formal way expected, though she tried her best to give up her "prayer of simplicity." Slow, quiet, and clumsy, she was assigned to help an infirmarian who was a bundle of energy.

On December 21, 1674, three years a nun, she received the first of her revelations. She felt "invested" with the presence of God, though always afraid of deceiving herself in such matters. The request of Christ was that his love for humankind be made evident through her.

During the next 13 months, Christ appeared to her at intervals. His human heart was to be the symbol of his divine-human love. By her own love Margaret Mary was to make up for the coldness and ingratitude of the world—by frequent and loving Holy Communion, especially on the first Friday of each month, and by an hour's vigil of prayer every Thursday night in memory of his agony and isolation in Gethsemane. He also asked that a feast of reparation be instituted.

Like all saints, Margaret Mary had to pay for her gift of holiness. Some of her own sisters were hostile. Theologians who were called in declared her visions delusions and suggested that she eat more heartily. Against her great resistance, Christ called her to be a sacrificial victim for the shortcomings of her own sisters, and to make this known.

After serving as novice mistress and assistant superior, Margaret Mary died at the age of 43, while being anointed. She said: "I need nothing but God, and to lose myself in the heart of Jesus."

Polskie Duszpasterstwo w Parafii św. Bernarda i św. Stanisława Kostki

28 NIEDZIELA ZWYKLA B

Z komentarza św. Cyryla Aleksandryjskiego, biskupa, do Księgi Aggeusza



W chwili przyjścia naszego Zbawiciela świątynia Boża objawiła się w sposób nieporównanie chwalebny; o tyle wspanialsza i wznioślejsza od dawnej, o ile kult starotestamentalny różni się od kultu chrześcijańskiego i ewangelicznego, a zapowiedź od rzeczywistości.

Na ten temat - jak sądzę - można powiedzieć, co następuje. Świątynia była jedna, i tylko w Jerozolimie. Ofiary sprawował w niej jeden lud izraelski. Odkąd jednak Jednorodzony Syn stał się nam podobny, chociaż był "Bogiem i Panem, oświecił nas" - jak powiada Pismo, odtąd cały świat napełnił się światyniami i niezliczonymi czcicielami, którzy duchowymi ofiarami i kadzidłami wielbią Boga wszechświata. To właśnie, jak sądzę, zapowiadał Malachiasz w imieniu Boga: "Ja jestem wielkim Królem - mówi Pan - imie moje będzie sławione między narodami, a na każdym miejscu składany bedzie mojemu imieniu dar kadzielny i ofiara czysta".

Tak wiec wspaniałość nowej światyni, czyli Kościoła, bedzie o wiele bogatsza. Tym, którzy zabiegają i trudzą się przy budowie tej świątyni, zostanie udzielony od Boga dar i nagroda z nieba -Chrystus. On jest dla wszystkich pokojem i "przez Niego mamy przystęp w jednym Duchu do Ojca". Pan zapowiada to w słowach: "Na tym miejscu udzielę pokoju, pokoju duszy, jako nagrody dla pracujących przy budowie tej świątyni". Na innym miejscu mówi także Chrystus: "Pokój mój daję wam". O tym, jak bardzo jest on pożyteczny, poucza święty Paweł: "Pokój Chrystusowy, który przewyższa wszelki umysł, będzie strzegł waszych serc i myśli". Także Izajasz, mędrzec, modlił się słowami: "Panie nasz, Boże, użycz nam pokoju, albowiem Ty odpłacasz wszystkie nasze czyny". Ci bowiem, co raz się stali godni pokoju Chrystusa, potrafia zachować swa duszę i skierować swe myśli ku przestrzeganiu cnoty.

Tak więc każdemu, kto buduje, obiecany jest pokój. Czy to gdy buduje Kościół, i jako mistagog wprowadzający w święte misteria postawiony jest na czele rodziny Bożej, czy też gdy doskonali własną duszę stając się żywym i duchowym kamieniem "świątyni Boga w Duchu", jako nagrodę osiągnie z łatwością zbawienie własnej duszy.





From Fr. Marcin's Desk

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Jesus teaches that it is very difficult for a rich person to enter the Kingdom of God, but not impossible; in fact, God can conquer the heart of a person who has many possessions and move him to solidarity and sharing with the needy, with the poor, to enter into the logic of the gift.

As often happens in the Gospels, everything begins from an encounter. In this case Jesus' meeting with a man who "had many possessions." He was a person who from his youth had faithfully observed the commandments of God's Law, but he had not yet found true happiness; this is why he asks Jesus what he must do to "inherit eternal life." On the one hand, like everyone else, he is after life in its fullness. On the other hand, being used to depending on his wealth, he thinks that he might be able to "buy" eternal life in some way, perhaps by observing some special commandment. Jesus welcomes the profound desire that is in him and, the evangelist notes, casts a gaze full of love upon him, God's own gaze. But Jesus also understands what the man's weakness is: it is precisely his attachment to his many possessions, and this is why he invites him to give everything to the poor, so that his treasure - and thus his heart - will no longer be on earth but in heaven, and adds: "Come! Follow me!" That man, instead of accepting Jesus' invitation, goes away sad since he is unable to give up his wealth, which can never give him happiness and eternal life.

It is at this point that Jesus offers his teaching to the disciples, and to us today: "How hard it is for those who have wealth to enter the kingdom of God!" The disciples are puzzled, and even more so when Jesus adds: "It is easier for a camel to pass through the eye of a needle than for one who is rich to enter the kingdom of God." But seeing that the disciples are astonished he says: "For human beings it is impossible, but not for God".

The story teaches the rich that they must not neglect their salvation as if they were already condemned. They need not throw their wealth into the sea or condemn it as insidious and hostile to life, but they must learn how to use their wealth and obtain life."
