

THIRTY-SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: I Kings 17:10-16

Elijah asked a widow for a cup of water and a piece of bread. She told him she was almost out of flour, and that she and her son would soon starve. Elijah told her not to be afraid, as God had told him the jar of flour would not go empty. So she did as he had asked and prepared bread from the last of her flour. As God had said, her jar did not go empty, and she and her son had plenty to eat.

Second Reading: Hebrews 9:24-28

The high priests entered the sanctuary each year and offered a sacrifice, but not a sacrifice of their own blood. Just as people die once and are judged, Christ was offered up once for the sins of many.

Gospel: Mark 12:38-44

Jesus expressed disgust over the hypocrisy of some of the scribes for wanting special treatment from the people. He watched the wealthy put large contributions into the collection box, but explained that what they gave was surplus wealth, and not a real sacrifice. He told them the biggest donation was a small amount from a widow, because she had given up the only money that she had to live on.

The Saint of the Week

St. Stanislaus Kostka

(November 13)

Stanislaus Kostka (Stanislaw Kostka, 1550-1568) is known for his youthful holiness and iron determination to follow God's call despite family obstacles. He was a Polish noble by birth and was destined for public life. In 1564 his parents sent Stanislaus and his older brother Paul to study at the newly opened Jesuit college in Vienna. Initially the two young nobles boarded in the Jesuit residence at the college, but moved to the house of Senator Kimberker after seven months. Kimberker was a staunch Lutheran who would not allow a priest to enter his home with the Blessed Eucharist. That became an issue when Stanislaus unexpectedly fell ill with an undiagnosed sickness in mid-December 1565. Stanislaus kept asking for Viaticum, but his brother put him off. Stanislaus prayed to God so he could receive Viaticum before he died. He had a mystical experience of Mary visiting him and placing the Christ Child in Stanislaus' arms, which he interpreted as meaning that he was to enter the Society of Jesus.

After this extraordinary experience, the young nobleman recovered and then approached the Jesuit provincial in Vienna to ask entrance into the Society. The provincial was favorable but said that he could not accept Stanislaus without his parents' approval, which Stanislaus knew they would not give. The determined student talked to another Jesuit who suggested he go to Augsburg, Germany to ask the provincial there, Father Peter Canisius, to accept him. Stanislaus decided to follow the suggestion and slipped out of Vienna on the morning of Aug. 10, 1567. He left behind his fine clothes and donned coarse pilgrim's robes, which hid him from his angry brother who had followed him on the road but did not recognize him dressed so poorly.

Stanislaus walked for 450 miles to Augsburg to see Fr. Canisius. He explained his desire and offered a letter of introduction from a Jesuit in Vienna. Canisius recognized his sincerity and spiritual qualities and decided to accept him. He also arranged for him to accompany two young Jesuits about to travel to Rome. Kostka and the two Jesuits left Germany in late September and arrived in Rome on Oct. 25, making their way to the residence of the superior general, Father Francis Borgia.

Stanislaus gave Canisius' letter of recommendation to Borgia, who had the young man remain at the Gesú for three months before going briefly to the Roman College and then to the novitiate of Sant'Andrea. Stanislaus's novitiate would only last 10 months. In early August 1568 he had a premonition he would soon die. He became sick with a fever. Since he did not seem to be gravely ill, the brother infirmarian discounted his premonition. On Aug. 14 Stanislaus told the infirmarian he would die the next day, but the remark was not taken seriously. Later that afternoon he took a turn for the worse and lost all strength. He received viaticum and prayed with the novices and other Jesuits who were with him. About three in the morning of the feast of our Lady's Assumption on August 15, he announced that Mary was approaching with angels to take him to heaven and soon died. St. Stanislaus Kostka is considered to be the patron saint of youth, young students, and seminarians.

Byliśmy nierozumni, czciliśmy kamienie, drzewa, przedmioty ze złota, srebra i żelaza, sporządzane ręką ludzi; całe nasze życie było właściwie śmiercią. Byliśmy pogrążeni w mroku, zaślepieni całkowicie, a oto odzyskaliśmy wzrok i dzięki Jego łaskawości oddaliliśmy ciemność, która nas otaczała.

Pan zmiłował się nad nami. Kiedy ujrzał nas zabłąkanych i ginących, nie mających żadnej, poza Nim, nadziei ocalenia, wybawił nas wiedziony miłosierdziem. Powołał nas, gdy jeszcze nie istnieliśmy; zechciał, abyśmy przeszli z nicości do istnienia!


"Raduj się, niepłodna, któraś nie rodziła; wołaj z radości i wykrzykuj, któraś nie doznała bólów rodzenia; bo liczniejsi są synowie porzuconej niż synowie tej, która ma męża". Słowa: "Raduj się, niepłodna, któraś nie rodziła" - odnoszą się do nas. Niepłodny bowiem był nasz Kościół, zanim zostały mu dane dzieci. Słowa zaś: "Wołaj z radości, któraś nie doznała bólów rodzenia" - zachęcają, abyśmy w szczerości zanosili nasze modlitwy do Boga i nie upadali na duchu, jak niewiasta doznająca bólów. A znowu słowa: "bo liczniejsi są synowie porzuconej niż synowie tej, która ma męża" - oznaczają, że naród nasz wydawał się opuszczony i porzucony przez Boga; teraz zaś, skoro uwierzyliśmy, staliśmy się liczniejsi od tych, których uważano za czcicieli Boga.

Na innym także miejscu mówi Pismo: "Nie przyszedłem powołać sprawiedliwych, ale grzeszników". Chrystus mówi tak, aby wykazać, iż pragnie zbawić ginących. Rzeczą naprawdę wielką jest bowiem podtrzymywanie nie tego, co stoi mocno, ale tego, co upada. Tak też i Chrystus chciał "zbawić to, co było zginęło", i ocalił wielu, bo przyszedł i wezwał nas, gdy szliśmy już ku ładzie.



From Fr. Marcin's Desk

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Today's Gospel presents us with two contrasting figures: the scribe and the widow. The scribe represents important, wealthy, influential people; the other person — the widow — represents the least, the poor, the weak.

Jesus exposes the perverse mechanism of the scribes: He denounces the oppression of the weak carried out misleadingly on the basis of religious motivations, declaring clearly that God is on the side of the least. And to really impress this lesson on the minds of the disciples He offers them a living example: a poor widow, whose social position was irrelevant because she had no husband who could defend her rights. Therefore, she became easy prey to unscrupulous creditors, because these creditors hounded the weak so they would pay them. This woman, who goes to the temple treasury to put in just two coins all that she had left — makes her offering by seeking to pass by unobserved, almost as if ashamed. But, in this humble way, she performs an act laden with great religious and spiritual significance – she gave everything that she had.

God does not measure quantity but quality; He examines the heart; He looks at the purity of intentions. This means that our "giving" to God in prayer and to others in charity should always steer clear of ritualism and formalism, as well as of the logic of calculation, and must be an expression of gratuity, as Jesus did with us: He saved us freely.

Jesus points to that poor and generous widow as a model of Christian life to be imitated. We do not know her name: however. we know her heart — we will find her in Heaven and go to greet her, certainly; and that is what counts before God.
