

BAPTISM OF THE LORD

First Reading: Isaiah 42:1-4. 6-7 Isaiah tells of the Lord's Servant, who will be inconspicuous, but will not rest until justice is established. The Lord then tells his servant that he was formed to be "a light for the nations."

Second Reading: Acts 10:34-38

Peter speaks to a group of pagans for the first time. He explains to them that any person who follows God's will is acceptable to God, regardless of nationality.

Gospel: Luke 3:15-16, 21-22

John the Baptist had claimed one would come far more powerful than himself, one who would baptize with the Holy Spirit rather than water. When Jesus came to John and was baptized, the Spirit descended on him and a voice said, "You are my beloved Son. On you my favor rests."

The Saint of the Week

St. Hilary of Poitiers, Bishop and Doctor (January 13)

Born into a wealthy pagan family in Poitiers, France, Hilary was well educated in the classics. As he looked into his own soul, however, he knew that he did not exist for the sole purpose of seeking pleasure, enjoying leisure, obtaining wealth, or merely satisfying his fleshly desires. Hilary reasoned that the human soul did not exist simply to die. Instead, it must exist for something more, something eternal, something glorious. When his pagan culture did not suffice, and philosophy fell short, Hilary finally found what he was searching for when he stumbled upon the Scriptures.

Hilary was first struck by the mysterious name of God in the Old Testament: "I AM WHO I AM." God had revealed Himself as eternal, without beginning or end—Existence itself. Then Hilary discovered the Son of God in the Gospel of John 1:1–14. Of this discovery, Hilary said, "My soul measured the mighty workings of God, wrought on the scale of His eternal omnipotence... by a boundless faith . . .that God was in the beginning with God, and that the Word became flesh and dwelt among us . . ."

Hilary had the will to believe, and in the years that followed he was given the power and gift to understand the beauty, mystery, omnipotence, and nature of the Most Holy Trinity. Shortly after these discoveries of faith, Hilary was baptized a Christian and went on to defend the doctrine of the Trinity against the "insanity and ignorance of men." He so impressed the faithful that they chose him to be their bishop, a dignity to which he reluctantly agreed.

Among those who shared in the "insanity and ignorance" of that time were a group of bishops and laity who followed the heresy of Arianism, which denied the divinity of Christ, instead holding that the Son was inferior to the Father. This heresy was especially strong in the Eastern Church but was starting to spread throughout France. After Hilary was a bishop for only about five years, the emperor, an Arian himself, ordered every bishop to pledge their support for this heresy. Hilary refused. Instead, he vigorously defended the truth, and for his brave stance was exiled to Phrygia, in modern-day Turkey. In His love and providence, God used Hilary's time of exile in powerful ways. While in Phrygia, Bishop Hilary spent much time studying and writing. He had already composed a marvelous commentary on the Gospel of Matthew while in Poitiers, and now he set his mind to his greatest work, De Trinitate (On the Trinity). Drawing from his classical education, his knowledge of Greek, his love of the Scriptures, and from the "insanity" and "ignorance" of Arianism itself, Bishop Hilary composed a comprehensive defense of the doctrine of the Trinity as it was taught in the Nicene Creed. Bishop Hilary caused so much trouble for the Arians in Phrygia that the Arian bishops pleaded with the emperor to send him back home, a request the emperor honored.

On his return to Poitiers, Bishop Hilary took the long way home through Greece and Italy, preaching all the way, weeding out the beginnings of Arianism in the Western Church. His effectiveness came not only from his clear teaching, but also from his conciliatory approach and resolute determination. Back in Poitiers, he continued to preach, write, attend councils, and even to compose hymns. The hymns were his way of introducing the doctrines of the faith to the people of God in song. He was a true pastor who burned with a desire that everyone come to a deeper knowledge of the One God—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

Chrzciciel nie wyraża zgody, Jezus nastaje. "To ja potrzebuję chrztu od Ciebie", mówi wtedy pochodnia do Słońca, głos do Słowa, przyjaciel do Oblubieńca, największy spośród narodzonych z niewiast do Pierworodnego wszelkiego stworzenia; ten, który poruszył się w łonie matki, do Tego, który w łonie hołd odbierał; poprzednik i mający poprzedzać do Tego, który się ukazał i ma przyjść. "To ja potrzebuję chrztu od Ciebie": dodaj - i za Ciebie. Jasne bowiem dla niego było, że męczeństwem będzie ochrzczony; albo jak Piotr nie tylko nogi będzie miał umyte.

Ale Jezus wychodzi z wody i unosi ze sobą w górę cały świat; widzi rozwierające się i otwarte niebiosa, które Adam zamknął dla siebie i dla swych potomków, tak jak i raj został mu zamknięty mieczem płomienistym.

A Duch daje świadectwo Bóstwu, gdyż zstępuje na równego sobie. I daje się słyszeć głos z nieba, gdyż stamtąd był Ten, który otrzymał świadectwo. I jako gołębica zstępuje Duch, aby widzialnie uczcić ludzkie ciało Jezusa, ponieważ i ono jest przebóstwione i w nim Bóg staje się widzialny. Podobnie i w zamierzchłych czasach gołębica zapowiedziała koniec potopu.

My zaś uczcijmy dzisiaj chrzest Chrystusa, obchodząc należycie to święto.

Przede wszystkim pozostańcie czyści i oczyszczajcie się. Bóg przecież niczym bardziej się nie raduje niż nawróceniem i zbawieniem człowieka, któremu została dana cała ta nauka i wszystkie tajemnice. I macie być jak źródła światła w świecie i siłą życiodajną dla ludzi. Macie być jak płonące światła przy owym wielkim świetle z nieba i napełnieni Jego promienistą jasnością, pełniej i wyraźniej jaśniejący blaskiem Trójcy Przenajświętszej. Bo przyjęliście teraz, choć jeszcze nie w pełni, jeden promień jedynego Boga, w Chrystusie Jezusie, Panu naszym, któremu chwała i panowanie przez wszystkie wieki. 

From Fr. Marcin's Desk

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

On this Sunday after the Epiphany, we celebrate the Baptism of Jesus, and we gratefully recall our Baptism. The Gospel presents Jesus, in the waters of the River Jordan, at the center of a wondrous divine revelation. St Luke writes: "when Jesus also had been baptized and was praying, the heaven was opened, and the Holy Spirit descended upon him in bodily form, as a dove, and a voice came from heaven, 'Thou art my beloved Son; with thee I am well pleased'." In this way Jesus is consecrated and manifested by the Father as the Savior Messiah and liberator.

In this event is the passing from the baptism of John the Baptist, symbolized by water, to the Baptism of Jesus "with the Holy Spirit and with fire." Indeed, the Holy Spirit is the principal artisan in Christian Baptism: it is He who burns and destroys original sin, restoring to the baptized the beauty of divine grace; it is He who frees us from the dominion of darkness, namely sin, and transfers us to the kingdom of light, namely love, truth and peace: this is the kingdom of light. Let us think about the dignity to which Baptism elevates us! "See what love the Father has given us, that we should be called children of God, and so we are," the Apostle John exclaims. This splendid reality of being Children of God entails the responsibility of following Jesus, the obedient Servant, and reproduces in us: docility, humility, tenderness. This is not easy, especially when there is so much intolerance, arrogance, harshness around us; however, with the strength we receive from the Holy Spirit it is possible!

The Holy Spirit, received for the first time on the day of our Baptism, opens our heart to the Truth, to all Truth. The Spirit impels our life on the challenging but joyful path of charity and solidarity toward our brothers and sisters. The Spirit gives us the tenderness of divine forgiveness and permeates us with the invincible power of the Father's mercy. Let us not forget that the Holy Spirit is a living and vivifying presence in those who welcome Him; He prays in us and fills us with spiritual joy.

Today, let us ponder the day of our Baptism. All of us were baptized, let us give thanks for this gift. Celebrating that day means and reaffirms our adherence to Jesus, with the commitment to live as Christians, members of the Church and of a new humanity, in which all are brothers and sisters.
