The Saint of the Week

St. John of Capistrano

(October 23)

St. John was born at Capistrano, Italy in 1385, the son of a former German knight in that city. He studied law at the University of Perugia and practiced as a lawyer in the courts of Naples. King Ladislas of Naples appointed him governor of Perugia. During a war with a neighboring town, he was betrayed and imprisoned. Upon his release he entered the Franciscan community at Perugia in 1416. He and St. James of the March were fellow students under St. Bernardine of Siena, who inspired him to institute the devotion to the Holy Name of Jesus and His Mother. John began his brilliant preaching apostolate with a deacon in 1420. After his ordination he traveled throughout Italy, Germany, Bohemia, Austria, Hungary, Poland, and Russia preaching penance and establishing numerous communities of Franciscan renewal. When Mohammed II was threatening Vienna and Rome, St. John, at the age of seventy, was commissioned by Pope Callistus III to preach and lead a crusade against the invading Turks. Marching at the head of seventy thousand Christians, he gained victory in the great battle of Belgrade against the Turks in 1456. Three months later he died at Illok, Hungary. His feast day is October 23. He is the patron of jurists.

Polskie Duszpasterstwo w Parafii św. Bernarda i św. Stanisława Kostki



29 Niedziela Zwykla

Ewangelia tei niedzieli ukazuje nam Jezusa borykającego się z obłudą swoich przeciwników. Prawią Mu wiele komplementów – na początku wiele komplementów – lecz potem zadają podchwytliwe pytanie, żeby Go postawić w kłopotliwej sytuacji i zdyskredytować wobec ludu. Pytaja Go: "Czy wolno płacić podatek cezarowi, czy nie?", to znaczy płacić świadczenia cesarzowi. W tamtym czasie w Palestynie panowanie imperium rzymskiego było źle tolerowane – i jest to zrozumiałe, byli najeźdźcami – również ze względów religijnych. Dla ludności kult cesarza, podkreślany także przez jego wizerunek na monetach, był zniewagą dla Boga Izraela. Rozmówcy Jezusa są przekonani, że ich odpytywanie nie ma alternatywy – albo "tak", albo "nie". Czekali, bo byli pewni, że właśnie tym pytaniem zapędzą Jezusa w kozi róg i wpadnie w ich pułapkę. On jednak zna ich przewrotność i wymyka się z sideł. Prosi ich, żeby Mu pokazali monetę, monete, która płacone były podatki, daniny, bierze ją do ręki i pyta ich, czyj wizerunek jest na niej wybity. Oni odpowiadają, że cezara, czyli imperatora. Wówczas Jezus odpowiada: "Oddajcie więc cezarowi to, co należy do cezara, a Bogu to, co należy do Boga".

Dając taką odpowiedź, Jezus staje ponad polemiką. Jezus zawsze jest ponad. Z jednej strony uznaje, że danina należna cezarowi winna być płacona – dotyczy to również nas wszystkich, podatki winny być płacone - bowiem wizerunek na monecie jest jego; ale przede wszystkim przypomina, że każdy człowiek nosi w sobie inny wizerunek – nosimy go w sercu, w

duszy – wizerunek Boga, i dlatego każdy z nas winien jest swoje istnienie, swoje życie Jemu i tylko Jemu.

W tym orzeczeniu Jezusa zawiera się nie tylko kryterium rozróżniania sfery politycznej i sfery religijnej, ale ujawniają się jasne wskazania co do misji wierzących wszystkich czasów, także dla nas dzisiaj. Płacenie podatków jest obowiązkiem obywateli, podobnie jak przestrzeganie słusznych praw państwa. Zarazem konieczne jest potwierdzanie prymatu Boga w ludzkim życiu i w historii przez przestrzeganie prawa Bożego w tym, co do Niego należy.

Z tego wynika misja Kościoła i chrześcijan – mówienie o Bogu i dawanie o Nim świadectwa mężczyznom i kobietom swoich czasów. Każdy z nas ze względu na chrzest jest powołany do tego, by był w społeczeństwie żywą obecnością, nasycał je Ewangelią i życiową limfą Ducha Świętego. Trzeba angażować się z pokorą i zarazem odważnie, wnosząc swój wkład w budowanie cywilizacji miłości, w której panują sprawiedliwość i braterstwo.

From Fr. Marcin's Desk Dear Brothers and Sisters,

After a long period of parable stories, today we have an actual discussion between Christ and the Pharisees, who are attempting to set a trap for Jesus. They knew that He was calling all to turn away from the corruption of the world and the superstitious practices of devotion invented by men, and instead to fix their thoughts and hopes upon His Kingdom of Heaven. Therefore, the Pharisees arranged a question: Is it lawful to give tribute to Caesar or not?

The answer of Christ that is given to them: Render, therefore, to Caesar the things that are Caesar's, and to God the things that are God's. What are the things of Caesar? All the concerns of this world, all the material things that we gain during our lifetime, all power and fame.... If we possess nothing that is Caesar's, we are not bound to render anything to him; but since we are concerned with the things of this world which are his, we make use of his power, and are subject to him as paid servants. When we take care of his property, we cannot question our duty to render to Caesar the things that are Caesar's.

All of us are always bound to render to God the things that are God's: our body, our soul, and our will. These things we obtain from Him, for He is our Creator. It is, therefore, just and proper that those who acknowledge that they owe to Him their being, life, and preservation, should render to Him all that they are and have.
